




Lessons from the Ride

- Make friends with other riders, your teacher, and the horse.
- Use the western saddle if this is what's needed to be successful.
- Let the horse lead.
- Cheer the risk-taker and celebrate the ride.

Tickets are \$30.





- The paper used is a renewable resource that comes from sustainable forest management
- Boxes are shipped flat which allows for more room (compared to shipping of plastic water bottles, it is a ratio of 1 to 26 trucks). The boxes are then filled at local stations where the water goes through an 8 step purification process.
- 100% recyclable poly-coated paperboard containers






What is a Lockdown?

A lockdown is an emergency action initiated to isolate students and staff from danger when there is a crisis inside or outside the building and movement within the school might put students in danger.

Examples:

- Gunfire
- Extreme violence inside or outside



Why Run, Hide, Fight?

Lockdown alone is not enough!

Option 1: Run Evacuate To Avoid

Implemented when it is unsafe to remain in the facility, and evacuation to an off-site assembly is possible



Protocols

- Know your egresses!
- Leave your personal belongings behind
- Attempt to warn others
- Go to the pre-arranged rally points
- If you encounter police officers, always follow their instructions

Option 2: Hide Barricade and Conceal



Purpose of A Lockdown

The purpose of a LOCKDOWN is to keep students and staff safe by removing them from hallways and placing them in secure rooms, away from danger, within the school building.

Lockdown Procedures

- Upon receipt of lockdown announcement, all persons in hallways should respond to the nearest known safe room.
- Lock and barricade the door.
- Turn off lights.
- Close blinds/drapes exterior & door windows.
- Turn off noise sources (e.g. radio, cell, etc.)

The Enhanced Lockdown



What is The Enhanced Lockdown?

- Barricade the door
- Spread out within the room and prepare with counter devices
- Look for alternate escape routes
- DO NOT open the door for anyone
- Dial 911 when safe to do so
- Maintain First Aid Supplies

Room Barricading Tips

- Use filing cabinets, desks or bookshelves to barricade a door if it opens inward.
- Placing a door stop backwards underneath a closed door provides additional security
- If there isn't a door stop, consider folding a magazine or newspaper and placing it underneath the door.

Option 3: Fight



Procedures

As a last resort, and only when your life is in imminent danger, disrupt and or incapacitate the shooter by:

- -Acting as aggressively as possible against him
- -Throwing items and improvising weapons
- Yelling
- Committing to your actions

Disrupting the active shooter Disrupting accurate shooting

- Target acquisition
- Sight picture/sight alignment
- Trigger control
- Stance
- Grip
- Breathing
